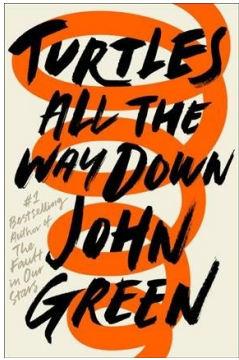

## **Turtles All The Way Down by John Green**

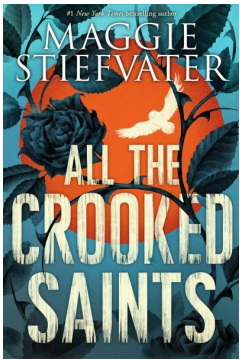
