### **YA Books Coming to a Streaming Service Near You**

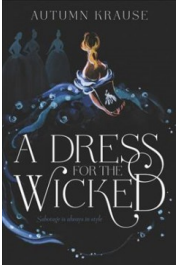
Two popular YA Books are coming to a steaming service near you.

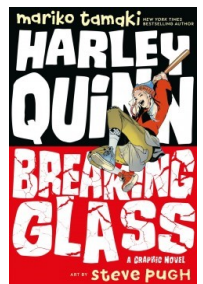

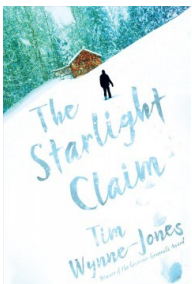
